The Garden of Eden: In Genesis, God is the one who plants the first garden and then places humanity in it "to work it and take care of it" (**Genesis 2:15**).

Farming as a Metaphor for Faith

God frequently uses agricultural imagery to teach spiritual lessons:

* **Sowing and Reaping:** The "Law of the Harvest" (Galatians 6:7) states that one reaps what they sow—both physically and spiritually.

* **Spiritual Growth:** Jesus' parables, such as the *Parable of the Sower*, use the different types of soil to represent how people receive spiritual truth.

* **The Vineyard:** God often compares His people to a vineyard that He carefully tends, looking for "good fruit" like justice and righteousness.
